I would like to submit public comments for Agenda Item 5A, Ordinance Enacting Water Conservation Measures and Requirements.

I submit the following questions:

Question 1

On July 8, 2021, Governor Gavin Newsom issued Executive Order N-10-21 state of emergency due to drought conditions to reduce the state overall demand by 14% and the State Water Resource Controls Board drought monitoring unit identifies Los Angeles County as D3 Extreme Drought condition. The city's Ordinance Enacting Water Conservation Measures and Requirements, Section 14.25.100 Determination of Drought Emergency, identifies that the city must consider declaring a Stage 1 or 2 Drought Emergency. **Does the city have plans on implementing a mandatory Stage 1 or 2 drought emergency plan? If yes. how soon?**

Question 2

The Staff Report's table shows since FY2015-2016 to present, the residence has reduced their water demand by approximately 13%. The residence has shown that they have been doing their part in water conservation. **How does the city plan on reducing demand an additional 14% per the Governor's July 8, 2021, Executive Order N-10-21 and can the city post on their website, a running monthly demand usage compared to same month of previous year, so residence can view usage and reduction?**

Question 3

Not too long ago, the city installed a new automatic water meter reading system. **How is the new automatic water meter reading system doing and is it being used for water conservation?**
